Finding ATR II Service Recipients: Helpful Websites

If an ATR II service recipient leaves services before the end of the authorization period please use this list of helpful websites for locating a service recipient in order to re-engage him/her in services and complete the follow-up GPRA interview.

- Department of Corrections Inmate locator – This site assists in locating service recipients who are incarcerated, have a parole officer or live in a DOC halfway house. Include the service recipient's date of birth when searching to ensure that you have the right person. <http://www.ctinmateinfo.state.ct.us/>
- Department of Corrections facilities – This site provides correctional facility phone numbers, the level of security and directions to the facility. <http://www.ct.gov/doc/cwp/view.asp?a=1502&Q=265422&docNav=1>
- Department of Corrections Privileged/ Professional Visitor Information – This site provides information on visiting hours, primary and secondary telephone contact information for each DOC facility and documentation needed to enter the correctional facility. <http://www.ct.gov/doc/lib/doc/pdf/PrivilegedVisitInfo.pdf>
- Department of Corrections – Parole Offices – This site provides phone numbers and addresses to all the area parole offices. <http://www.ct.gov/doc/cwp/view.asp?a=1520&q=284830&docNav=140574>
- Judicial Branch – Probation offices – This site provides phone numbers and addresses to all the area probation offices. <http://www.jud.ct.gov/directory/directory/adultprob.htm>
- Bureau of Federal Prison- Inmate locator – This site provides locator information on service recipients who are incarcerated in a federal prison, being extradited to CT or being held by the Federal Marshall. <http://www.bop.gov/>
- 211 – This site is a search engine for shelters, providers and other resources. You can look up all the homeless shelters, methadone clinics, DSS offices etc in the area the service recipient was last located. If you know that the service recipient usually goes to a specific shelter, clinic, DSS office you can find the information here. <http://www.211ct.org/referweb/>
- Judicial Branch – Case Look-up (pending and archived) – This site has all open and some archived cases for many fields such as housing court, motor vehicle court, family court, criminal court, small claims court etc. <http://www.jud.ct.gov/jud2.htm>
- CT Department of Public Safety Sex Offender Registry locator – Individuals who were incarcerated for a sex offense after October 1, 1988 are required to register when they are released. - Landlord Directory – If you know your service recipient's last known address this website can provide you with the service recipient's landlord name, address and phone number. You can call the landlord and see if the service recipient has left a forwarding address or any contact information. <http://www.visionappraisal.com/databases/ct/index.htm>
- Free People search engines – These sites are helpful when attempting to locate a service recipient contact or if you have a service recipient address with no phone number.
