

Intensive Case Management (ICM) Services

As the Administrative Services Organization for the DMHAS Behavioral Health Recovery Program (BHRP), **Advanced Behavioral Health, Inc** provides direct case management supports to individuals on Husky D.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Case management supports are available to individuals anywhere in the state who are currently or potentially eligible for Husky D benefits from the State of Connecticut Department of Social Services.

The BHRP Intensive Case Management Program is available to provide support and engagement for individuals with complex needs related to substance abuse and/or behavioral health disorder(s). The target population includes but is not limited to:

- Individuals with a recent or history of overdose in the last 12 months.
- Individuals with repeated acute care admissions, either for detox or for mental health hospitalization.
- Individuals who have been previously case managed by ICM/ERSC
- Individuals who have self-referred themselves
- Referrals from community providers who are able to identify case management needs.

WHAT SERVICES ARE PROVIDED?

The ABH Recovery Specialist will assess individuals and work with each individual to develop a recovery plan that will meet the person's specific needs. The Recovery Specialist will work closely with the individual in the community to assist him/her in moving through the recovery continuum. Services may include assistance with connecting to behavioral health or medical treatment, housing, and/or employment. Case management staff also helps with access to a variety of recovery supports, including transportation resources, obtaining identification and sober housing.

HOW DO I MAKE A REFERRAL?

If you have an individual who is currently or potentially eligible for Husky D with a substance abuse and/or behavioral health disorder and specific case management needs the provider or the client can call 1-800-606-3677 and press option #3. Our Behavioral Health Quality Specialists (BHQS) are available Monday through Friday between 8:30 am and 5:00 pm and will ask for some basic information including a Release of Information (ROI) signed by the individual.
