



Supported Recovery Housing Services Request for Qualified Contractors – 2026 Questions & Answers

1. Q: I reviewed the recently released RFQC and noticed that this cycle is focused on providers serving the Greater Bridgeport and Greater Waterbury regions. We currently operate in East Hartford, so I wanted to ask whether you anticipate a future RFQC or qualification opportunity for providers serving the Greater Hartford/Region 3 area.
A: The current RFQC is seeking proposals for beds statewide, with additional consideration given to those serving the specific areas and populations as listed on page 1. There is no information on future RFQC opportunities at this time.
2. Q: If we are in DMHAS region 4, but are working with special populations in region 1 and 5, can we apply? Will a proposal from us be accepted? It says priority is given. It doesn't say only these two DMHAS regions.
A: The RFQC is seeking proposals for beds statewide, with additional consideration given to those serving the specific areas and populations as listed on page 1.
3. Q: Our recovery home is located in East Hartford and primarily serves women across the Greater Hartford region (and referrals from across Connecticut). Since the priority areas mention the City of Hartford specifically, would an East Hartford location serving the Greater Hartford community be eligible for consideration?
A: The RFQC is seeking proposals for beds statewide, with additional consideration given to those serving the specific areas and populations as listed on page 1.
4. Q: We are a non-clinical recovery housing program. Our model focuses on structured housing, recovery support, employment pathways and coordinated community partnerships rather than providing clinical treatment. Could you clarify how ABH defines the required weekly case management services? Whether recovery-focused navigation, care coordination, recovery planning and linkage to community resources would satisfy that expectation?
A: Additional details on the required components of SRHS case management may be found on pages 3-5 of the RFQC.
5. Q: I've read the notice for support recovery houses and it listed a variety of areas but did not include New Haven. My only question, is Whether this request include includes New Haven ?
A: The RFQC is seeking proposals for beds statewide, with additional consideration given to those serving the specific areas and populations as listed on page 1.
6. Specifically, I would like to know if the opportunity is limited to the Waterbury (DMHAS Region 5) and Bridgeport (DMHAS Region 1) areas.
