



Supported Recovery Housing Services Request for Qualified Contractors – 2026 Questions & Answers

1. Question: ‘We have seven Sober Living homes now throughout CT. They are spread throughout Bristol, New Britain, Middletown, and Willimantic. Would any of these towns qualify for this request?’

Answer: All service locations must be in one of the towns identified on p.1 of the RFQC.

2. Question: ‘Is the supportive housing in Bridgeport and Waterbury only is it not for Hartford County?’

Answer: All service locations must be in one of the towns identified on p.1 of the RFQC.

3. Question: I operate a recovery home in Plainfield CT. This RFQC would not be available to us.’

Answer: All service locations must be in one of the towns identified on p.1 of the RFQC.

4. Question: ‘We wanted to ask whether a Hartford-based women-only residence would be eligible for consideration during this round, or if eligibility is limited strictly to the identified Waterbury and Bridgeport target areas.

Answer: All service locations must be in one of the towns identified on p.1 of the RFQC.

5. Question: Writing to clarify the geographical eligibility for the current Request for Qualified Contractors (RFQC) Can organizations from other regions, such as Region 3 or Region 4, apply for this RFP? Specifically, I would like to know if the opportunity is limited to the Waterbury (DMHAS Region 5) and Bridgeport (DMHAS Region 1) areas’
